Scope and Content *a brief description of the types of materials in the collection.*

The collection contains six diaries of Monsignor William J. Bronner written during the 1920's when he was studying in Europe at the Gregorian University in Rome. The diaries are primarily in English (some in German) describing Bronner's travels throughout Europe. Bronner was a professor of moral theology at St. Francis Seminary (1926-1943) and a pastor for 27 years in the Archdiocese of Milwaukee.

Box and Folder List *This is a list of folders names within the collection. The diaries have been arranged chronologically. "B" is an abbreviation for box and "F" is an abbreviation for folder. This list will help the researcher narrow down exactly what folder they want to look at.*
