**Biographical Note**

Rev. Raymond F. Budde was born in Beaver Dam, WI on February 15, 1914. He attended St. Francis Minor Seminary from 1934-1936 and St. Francis Seminary from 1936-1943. He was ordained to the priesthood by Archbishop Moses Kiley on November 30, 1943 at St. John's Cathedral. He was assigned to St. Boniface, Milwaukee and St. James in Mukwonago. His three brothers: Gerard, George, and John were also priests of the Archdiocese of Milwaukee

**Scope and Content Note** *a brief description of the types of materials in the collection.*

This collection contains one scrapbook from Rev. Raymond Budde's days at St. Francis Seminary from approximately 1933 to 1940. Photographs document life at St. Francis Seminary including the Villa on Lake Delavan, the arrival of Archbishop Moses Kiley, plays, football/basketball games, candid, and group class shots. Family shots were removed from the album prior to its donation to the archives.
