Biographical Note

Thomas More Gard was born in Wauwatosa, WI on October 3, 1936, and grew up in Oconomowoc, WI. He attended St. Francis Minor Seminary from 1950-1956, and then St. Francis Major Seminary from 1956-1959. He attended St. Francis School of Philosophy and Theology from 1959-1963. He continued his education at the University of Notre Dame and St. Norbert College in De Pere, WI. Gard was ordained into the priesthood on May 25, 1963, at the Cathedral of St. John the Evangelist in Milwaukee. He was assigned to St. Mary's in Sheboygan Falls from 1963-1965, and was later transferred to St. Monica's in Whitefish Bay from 1965-1971. From 1968 to 1971 he taught religion at Dominican High School. He left the priesthood in 1971. From 1971 to 1985 Gard taught at the University of Wisconsin-Madison and worked as a regional manager for Brunswick and AMF. He left AMF in 1985, and in 1987 he married Linda in Houston, Texas. The couple moved from Houston to Washington State where they lived from 1987-2014. In 2014 they moved back to Waukesha and Gard retired. He passed away on November 14, 2023.
