

# Basics of Classroom Management

- 1. Build relationships
- 2. Lay down clear rules
- 3. Come to class prepared
- 4. Meet students where they are



## **Build Relationships**

- Get to know your students' names
- Get to know them
  - School
  - Interests
  - Activities
- Share your experiences (appropriately)
- Increases trust and participation in activities
- Increases the the positivity in the group dynamic
- Older vs. younger students



# Lay Down Clear Rules

- Know your space
- Set up expectations
- Be clear
- Be consistent
- Older vs. younger students



## Come to Class Prepared

- Review your material
- Make connections
- Being prepared will help with flow of the class
- Down time is not your friend
- Down time? Must be structured!
- Older vs. younger students



## **Meet Students Where They Are**

- You know the make-up of your parish
- Families have changed
- Different backgrounds
- Different baggage
- Different journeys
- "What do we want to learn this year?"
- Older vs. younger students




#### Potential Parts to Include in Your Class

# Increase Class Engagement

- Snacks!

- Think, Pair, Share

#### **Issues in Class?**

- Know the protocol of your parish

- Share with program leader
- Involve program leader if it doesn't improve


